- A Chinese export 'Imari' floral dessert plate, Qianlong, 23cms diameter; and three Chinese 'Imari' saucers with dragon decoration, 13.5cms. (4) £50-100

- A late 19th Century Chinese carved rootwood figure of a reclining sage with small boy, inset bead eyes and bone teeth, fitted carved hardwood stand, 42cms. £100-150
- A small Chinese rust coloured jade figure of a recumbent dog, with carved details and curled tail, fitted rosewood stand, 6cms. (2) £150-250
- A Chinese bronze arrow vase of archaic form, of typical Hu form, cast with double loop handles and stylised Taotie masks, the body with 'rope' decoration, 30.5cms. £400-600

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- An interesting Chinese cloisonne enamel snuff bottle of flattened pear shape, decorated to the neck with a band of prunus flowers and to each side with a shou roundel flanked by pairs of chilong and phoenix on a gilt matted ground, with lotus borders and ruyi heads, 5.4cms.

- A small Chinese carved pink coral figure of a woman in traditional costume, fitted hardwood base, 7cms; and a Cantonese relief carved bamboo section decorated with figures, boat, rocks and trees, the reverse with an inscription, signed, 15cms x 6cms. £80-120
- A Chinese small bronze censer of shallow circular form with three shallow dome feet, double loop handles, cast with six character Xuande mark, 13cms diameter. £80-120
