- A Vienna porcelain tea kettle, late 19th Century, outside decorated by The Franz Dorfl factory, Vienna, with a continuous classical scene titled 'Die Wissenschaften' (The Sciences), signed A. Wellz, on a solid gold band, blue ground, cast gilt metal dolphin brackets and porcelain handle, gilt blanked factory mark, overglaze printed mark for Franz Dorfl in pale blue, titled in iron-red script, 16.5cms with handle raised. £300-500
