Giovanni Antonio Canal, commonly known as "Canaletto," was born in Venice in 1697, the son of the painter Bernardo Canal; hence his mononym Canaletto ("little Canal"). A notable member of the 18th-century Venetian school, he is renowned for his cityscapes or vedute, in Venice, Rome, and London. He also painted imaginary views, or Capricci, within which the lines between real and imaginary worlds become blurred. A notable follower of Canaletto's style was his nephew Bernardo Bellotto (1722-1780), and Bellotto is known to have painted a few versions of the view of the Santa Maria della Salute and the Dogana, in or around 1743.

Between the years 1746 and 1756 Canaletto moved to England, where he painted many views of London and other sites, including Alnwick Castle. He was very successful during this period, thanks to the British merchant and connoisseur Joseph "Consul" Smith, whose large collection of Canaletto's works was sold to King George III in 1762. While in London he crossed paths with the artist William James (1754-1771), who is understood to have been a studio assistant to Canaletto, and later a painter in his own right, depicting "Canaletti" paintings, or works in the style associated with Canaletto. The term Canaletti was coined during the 18th Century, and used by J M W Turner for the title of his painting "Bridge of Sighs, Ducal Palace and Custom House in Venice: Canaletti painting" (1833), further demonstrating the reach and influence of the work of the Old Master. **£30,000-50,000**
