Note: Gunner Robley Strong died on the 30th September 1917. He was killed in action whilst serving with the D Battery, 18th Brigade, Royal Field Artillery, aged 23

He was born in 1894 near Castleside in County Durham and in 1911 was working as a farm worker at Street Side Farm on the A66 near Boldron. He enlisted at Richmond, Yorkshire and first served in France on 26 September 1915.

The Teesdale Mercury of 24 Oct 1917 reported that:-Mrs Strong, of Boldron, has received an intimation from Second-Lieutenant G. Proctor of the North Staffordshire Regiment, that her son, Private R. Strong, has been killed in action. The writer expresses the deepest sympathy of himself and all the officers, and adds: "I was sitting just outside the officers' mess when suddenly a shell hit the cook-house, about five yards away, and your son was killed instantly. He always did his duty well, and was a brave fellow. His death has upset us all very much." Second-Lieutenant Kenneth P. Sawyer says: "Private Strong was a favourite of both men and officers, and had always shown the greatest coolness and courage. His body was buried in a proper grave, and with military honours."

11 A Military OBE medal, awarded to Eric Tennant Cowan (1892-1977), in original case by Garrard & Co Ltd.

Notes: Eric served in the First World War as part of the Cheshire Regiment, 17th Lancers, and Lancashire Fusiliers. He lost an arm while in active service. Despite is injury he stayed in France after the Armistice and aided in the clearance of Battlefields and the organisation of Military Cemeteries. It was for this work that King George V bestowed the honour of OBE on him in 1919 within the New Year's Honours list.

Notes: After completing his studies in Berlin, Oscar Hirschberg began working in 1889, initially in the city of Bromberg, which was then in the Prussian Province of Posen. In 1920 Bromberg, now Bydgoszcz, became part of Poland, perhaps one reason the doctor moved his office to Berlin in 1921. The licenses of the more than 3,000 Jewish doctors practising medicine in the German Reich expired in October 1938. Starting in 1933, it had become increasingly difficult for them to earn a living from their profession due to anti-Jewish boycotts, local initiatives by professional organisations, and discriminatory regulations. In the autumn of 1938, only 709 of the doctors considered Jewish under the Reich Citizenship Law were granted special licenses to continue practising medicine, and they were only permitted to treat Jewish patients and their own wives and children. The special licenses could be revoked at any time. The Jewish practitioners were also prohibited from calling themselves "doctors," and their offices had to be identified accordingly. Doctors in "mixed marriages" were often the ones to receive special licenses. Likewise, Oscar Hirschberg survived the Shoah thanks to his non-Jewish wife. He continued practising medicine in Berlin until his death in 1946.
