P.S. Since writing the above, I got Cate Haste's book about Sheila off the shelf and discovered the bill for the Haycart picture. She called the picture "Haycart towards Evening, Cumberland". It is 20"x24" and dated 1970. I paid £150 for it, but the bill is not receipted, and I'm not sure whether she or her mother wrote it. At some time in the past, I have added (near Brothers Water) to the title." £18,000-25,000

He recalls that the work may have been purchased from the Stone Gallery in Newcastle upon Tyne, possibly from her 1969 exhibition."

A section in the former owner's account *My Shiela Fell Paintings, and My Memories of Her*, reads "We were invited to her exhibitions at The Stone Gallery in Ridley Place, Newcastle, and about that time asked her to paint another small picture for us. This was "Allonby from Dub Mill Point" and she told me that she had been out with Mr. Lowry sketching when she did the sketch for this. This is unsigned, which was to have been rectified later, but never was. It represents a short period when she was experimenting with dark varnish - hence its overall brownish appearance - and I don't think this lasted very long. I believe this was inspired by one of the Old Masters,...The picture is again 12" x 10", and the view is very similar to plate (66?) in Cate Haste's book "*Sheila Fell, A Passion for Paint*", but I think pre-dated this by about four years, as the latter is unvarnished and dated 1965.

The account *My Shield Fell Paintings, and My Memories of Her* throws further light on above and recounts "Shiela had by then...begun to shock Aspatria acquaintances, including Mother, with her 'gloomy' views of The Lake District which intrigued my wife and me and we eventually decided we would like one of these views for ourselves. I told Mother this, and asked her to inquire of Mrs Fell about the possibility, and after several comments of the 'you're not really serious' type, I finally persuaded her. This led quite some time later to word from Sheila that my painting was ready - so we arranged a meeting and were offered 'View over Harniston to the Caldbeck Fells from Brayton Road, Aspatria', liked it and bought it. I did query a small round patch of viridian green in the centre-left foreground, and Sheila's reply was that she had just felt something of the sort was needed to finish the painting off."
