



Note: Paul Crespin was a French Huguenot silversmith who entered his first marks for the two standards in 1720 and 1721. His powers and reputation grew quickly and substantially, and his client list became very impressive indeed, to include the Duke of Somerset and the King of Portugal. His work was of a consistently high standard and worthily rivalled that of his contemporary, Paul de Lamerie (See Grimwade, AG: London Goldsmiths & their marks pp 478, 479).
