Dobson stayed on to work as a tutorial student under Lawrence Gowing, Roger de Grey and Christopher Cornford, later becoming a full-time member of staff at Newcastle University. An accidental head injury led to his retirement in 1989. Dobson was a representational and abstract painter, the Euston Road School and especially Victor Pasmore being influences. He showed in London and Paris and had a memorial exhibition at University of Northumbria, Newcastle, in 1994.
