

Notes: David Roberts, already a respected topographical artist, left London on 21st August 1838 and reached Alexandria on 24th September. His purpose was to travel the Near East, making drawings of the great sites of historical and religious interest. Roberts spent three months sailing up the Nile from Cairo as far as Nubia and Abu Simbel. Back in Cairo in January 1839, Roberts made the acquaintance of Mr J. Pell, and agreed to travel with him to Syria via Suez and Mount Sinai. They and a fellow Scot, John Kinnear, along with their servants, departed on 7 February.

After pausing a few days at St. Catherine's Monastery in Sinai, the party moved along the Gulf of Aqaba. At Aqaba they dined with the local sheikh, with whom they negotiated safe passage to Hebron via Petra and Mount Hor. Enduring sandstorms, bandits, illness, and physical hardships along the way, the group arrived in the village of Hebron, where they stayed with the only Christian family from 16-18 March 1839:

"On turning round the side of a hill, Hebron first bursts upon

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you. The situation is beautiful, and the houses, gleaming brightly in the noonday sun, reminded me of England... I made two coloured sketches of the town" (the artist's journal, as quoted in Ballantine, 1866, p. 124).

Having learnt that Jerusalem was quarantined for plague, they made a detour via Beth Gebrin, the ancient Eleutheropolis, Gaza, Askelon, Ashdod, Jaffa, and Lod. They entered Jerusalem on Good Friday; the quarantine was removed that morning, and they were just in time for Easter celebrations. Accommodation was hard to come by, but luckily they met Elias, with whom they had stayed in Hebron, and he was able to find them lodgings. Continuing on through Galilee, Roberts stopped in Nazareth, Cana, and Acre, before reaching Baalbek in the Lebanon. By now ill, Roberts pressed on to Beirut. From there he began the long journey home, arriving in London in July of 1839.

Roberts's intent was to produce lithographs, based on his sketches, for sale to the public. Both his former publishers, Messrs. Finden, and John Murray, turned him down before Francis Graham Moon agreed to the project. Roberts produced a series of finished watercolours, including the present lot, which he had worked up from sketches made during his tour. £1,500-2,500








Sir James Knott was born in January 1855 at Howdon on Tyne, the eldest of ten children. James was educated at the Scotch School in North Shields, but left at the age of 14 to start work as a shipping clerk on Newcastle Quayside. At the age of 19, James started as a shipbroker, and in 1878 he acquired his first ship, forming the beginning of the Prince Line. In addition to the shipping line, which was based at Milburn House in Newcastle, James set up the Ashington Coal Company.

His increasing wealth from these ventures meant that Knott and his family could afford to live in some of the finest houses, including Monks Haven overlooking Cullercoats Bay, and Close House near Wylam in Northumberland (now the Close House Hotel). Not content with shipping and coal, James studied law and was called to the Bar at the age of 34. He was also MP for Sunderland.

After the First World War, in which he fought as an Officer in the Worcestershire Regiment, in 1919, he joined the Diplomatic Service and served at the British embassy in Belgrade from 1919 to 1922, at the Foreign Office from 1922 to 1930 and at the embassy in Moscow from 1930 to 1933. During his time in Moscow, he played an important role in the Metro-Vickers Engineers trial, in which six British engineers were accused of spying. He returned to the Foreign Office in 1933 and held office as head of the League of Nations section until 1937 and of the Central Department from 1937 to 1939. During the 1930s he was an adviser to the government at the major international meetings, and met Mussolini, Hitler and Stalin. He was a tacit opponent of appeasement, but always stayed loyal to the government. Strang was present at the major conferences between the Allied leaders during the Second World War. In 1943 Strang was appointed the British representative on the European Advisory Commission, with the rank of ambassador. The commission was established by the Allies to study the possible post-war political problems in



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Europe and make recommendation but was dissolved at the Potsdam Conference. In June 1945, Strang became political adviser to the Commander-in-Chief of British forces in Germany, Bernard Montgomery.


