In 1811 his bust of the radical reformer John Tooke was exhibited at the Royal Academy after which many commissions followed, including statues of King William IV in Windsor Castle and at Brighton. Other notable sitters were King George IV, the Duke of Wellington, William Pitt, George Washington in the State House, Boston, as well as Sir Walter Scott. Chantry received his Knighthood in 1835 and died on 25th November 1841.


